President - Kordell Walsh

Hey everyone! It's hard to believe that it's almost June!! These past few weeks have been a busy time with conferences and strategic planning! It's been great settling into the role and beginning to see things fall in place as we prepare for the year ahead!

NBSA

We held our NBSA transition conference, and it was insightful. It helped me gain a better understanding of the inner workings of the NBSA, and its relationships with various stakeholders, such as the Ministry of Post-Secondary Education, Training, and Labour (PETL) or the Fredericton Chamber of Commerce. We also received media relations training from STU, which was very valuable to me! We also elected our Chair and Vice Chair. Our next big NBSA conference is in a few weeks, and it will focus on policy.

CASA

As I am writing this, Tea and I are almost done with CASA Foundations, my first conference with the Canadian Alliance of Student Associations. The conference was held virtually this year due to COVID, and despite the virtual platform we've had some great discussions and learned plenty. Through this conference, I have gained a better understanding of how CASA functions. We also received bystander intervention training and cultural competency training. The second half of the conference is focused on issues that matter to student associations across the country, and the election of CASA's board of governors and committee membership.

Strategic Planning

Strategic planning went great. We dedicated three days to strategic planning, and we had lots of great discussions about improving our services, advocacy work, and general vision for the coming year! Our student feedback survey was well received, and we have gotten so much great feedback. This has been very helpful, and guided our conversations during strategic planning. I'm very excited to be able to show you folks the plan. Now I'm working on short initiative descriptions for the initiatives I will be taking on, and the rest of the plan is in the hands of Niko, who is putting things on paper, and making them look great!

Other Meetings/Business

Over the last two weeks I have also had various additional meetings. I attended the last Board of Governors meeting as a guest in a virtual format. It was a great introduction into how the board operates and I'm really excited for the coming year. I have also met with some committees and have become more involved in their work. They have been great introductions to university administrators and ongoing work within the university. Lastly, I have been working on organizing and finalizing things with the amalgamation of ALPS (the student organization that represented Adult Learners and Part-Time Students) so that it will be a smooth transition in the fall.

Vice President Advocacy- Téa Fazio

It has been a busy time of transitioning into CASA and the NBSA for me as well as working on our Strategic Plan for the year. Our team has jumped full-force into the work for our roles and we are getting settled in the office. There is a lot going on but it is so exciting to begin to envision what the coming year will look like.

Strategic Planning

Our executive team took on strategic planning to determine our goals for next year and for the SU as a whole as well as to lay out what initiatives we each want to make happen. I hosted a discussion on our advocacy goals for the year which include giving students more opportunities to get involved, a likely federal election coming up, sexual violence prevention, mental health, and so much more. It was three full days of intense meetings but we came out of it with a great plan and as a stronger team. I can't wait for you folks to see the new plan when it is finished.

Asian Heritage Month

The first post for Asian Heritage Month went out on our social media, it focused on defining why we celebrate and recognize AHM as well as defining what groups of people generally belong within the broad category of being Asian. Stay tuned for the next post. Niko did a ton of the work to make my research look readable and eye-catching along with some incredible advice, so major thanks to her!

Statement on Violence in Palestine/Israel

The UNBSU released a statement recognizing the violence that has been taking place in Palestine and Israel and providing resources for students whose mental health may be impacted by it. Niko and I worked on research and drafting of this statement which we then reviewed as a team. It has been challenging as the UNBSU has to remain nonpartisan as an organization but we felt it was still important to

recognize the feelings of many of our students while trying to remain neutral on the political side of things. Another shoutout to Niko for meeting with students who had feedback about the statement and for working with me to make changes to the statement so it better reflects what students want to see.

Sexual Violence Prevention (SVP)

The UNB Sexual Violence Policy Review Committee met to determine the next phase in our consultations, I suggested that we put out a survey for all students to share their feedback about our procedures at UNB, stay tuned for that coming out on the UNBSU socials soon.

Consultations

I have continued introductory conversations with the VP Externals from other universities in Canada. Kordell and I met with members of the executive teams at St. Mary's University SU (in Halifax), Athabasca University SU (Alberta), and the University of Calgary SU (Calgary). We also participated in a meet and greet session for all the maritime CASA members.

Kordell and I met to discuss ways in which the VP Advocacy role has changed over the past 5 years or so and whether the name is really representative as Deanna (VP Internal) does a lot of advocacy work as well. This process is ongoing.

NBSA

Kordell and I attended NBSA Transition over the weekend to meet the other board members from MtA, STU, and UNB-SJ. We participated in media training, a review of the purpose and procedures of the NBSA, meetings with the Fredericton Chamber of Commerce and members of PETL (Postsecondary Education Training and Labour), and more. Looking forward to policy and strategy planning in June with the NBSA to determine our shared priorities and advocacy objectives for the year.

CASA

Kordell and I have been participating in a virtual Foundations conference with CASA (the "national union of student unions") where we have been covering a lot of content from the current political landscape and policies to EDI and bystander training, and more. Foundations is taking up most of my week but I am excited to be building connections with other SUs across Canada and learning more about CASA.

Mental Health

Brennan and I met with Matt MacLean from UNB Counselling to brainstorm about a mental health campaign for the upcoming year that focuses on breaking stigmas about mental health and mental illness as well as highlights the different resources we have available on campus.

Fun Stuff

Our executive had a meeting about our workplace boundaries and best ways to support each other during strategic planning. We also went out for a picnic lunch on the Quad to enjoy the newfound sunshine.

Book Buy & Sell / APC

The UNBSU Book Buy & Sell is a week-long event that happens once a semester, usually right at the start. This week I have gone through Grace Mangussos notes on the buy & sells that she had run with her Academic Programming Coordinator and am thrilled to say that they will be happening in person this coming year! The space is officially booked and as I booked I discussed the potential need for an operational plan to abide by university public health guidelines and I do believe it can happen (just not at full capacity). I am absolutely thrilled for this, and as APC applications close tonight, I am looking forward to starting this project fully.

Menstrual Product Dispenser

This past week I have restarted discussions surrounding the Free Menstrual Product Dispensers on campus with UNB Staff. Coincidentally, I was also contacted by a lovely student who is eager to expand the project with the UNBSU. After meeting to discuss her vision for the project, I'm happy to say that we will be collaborating with Caroline Stephens over this coming year to push the free dispenser proposals through campus. Hopefully as this project becomes successful, Caroline and I will be looking into long-term implementation strategies to ensure this project does not fall victim to a lack of institutional memory and is lost in turnover. She is incredibly enthusiastic and passionate about this proposal and I am thrilled to have her advocate with me on this vision.

Retail Review Committee

Thursday afternoon Kordell and I attended the Retail Service Review committee to discuss some proposed changes to the Student Union Building (SUB). While this committee is confidential until the changes are finalized I unfortunately cannot share too much, however I will say that I am looking forward to having meaningful and student-interest focused conversations within this group.

Meeting with UNB Libraries

On Friday I met with Lesley Balcom, the Dean of Libraries to discuss some upcoming (and exciting) projects I have planned for the year. She has been supportive of UNBSU efforts in the past and I am very excited to work with her this year as VP Internal.

Senate Standing Committees and SU Committees Update

I'm finally making progress on the committee recommendations I will be sending to Senate Nominating Committee! After many adjustments I have found a way that works for the executives that will be occupying seats as well as our senators' choices. I will be sending out these placements to the senators before submission to the committee just to ensure they are informed as to what is happening, but then we will be good to go!

Clubs and Societies Rebranding

With help of Niko Coady, we were able to update the document in regards to the constitution policies on the UNBSU Clubs and Societies page. After our initial discussion about the removal of non-existing deals on the Clubs and Societies page, Niko removed them and updated that section as well.

As I had previously communicated the addition of a conferences tab on the UNBSU Clubs and Societies page, I was able to discuss it with the whole team within our weekly executive meeting. Niko also made a great point of including the document page about Inclusion and Diversity within all the new information we would be posting on the platform. The team agreed upon the idea to host this new tab catered to any student or clubs and societies led conferences, that can include workshops as well.

I had a meeting with Kaitlyn Catts from the UNB Conference Services and she was on board with this idea of incorporating a conferences tab on the UNBSU website. More than that, she provided an idea to embed the conference event registration form on the tab as well.

Hiring

The application deadline for all the three positions- Director of Campus Events, Academic Programming Coordinator and the Clubs & Societies Coordinator, have been extended till May 28th, Friday (mid-night). Till now, we have a good amount of applications coming in for all these three positions. The interview questions related to the respective positions have been sent to the supervisors and they have made the appropriate changes to them.

Orientation

I forwarded the script and document about the Sponsorship package content to Orientation Chair, Ellen Petrie. We have a meeting scheduled to talk about the Orientation sponsorship this week as well.

Strategic Planning

Our team's strategic planning occurred from Wednesday May 19th- Friday May 21st. We went through the Vision 2023 document and looked into role specific aspects covered under the document. From the list of all the major and minor events made by us, I am organizing and assisting fellow team members with the Finance Week, Clubs and Societies Fair, Implementation of Blind Hiring practices, International week and Global Gala, creation of Policy and EDI coordinators, etc.

I have already started brainstorming ideas about the Financial Literacy part with Brennan and the hiring for our coordinators is going well for now. I would soon sit down with Tea and start formalizing the Employment Equity plan. We would also discuss and go over the implementation of blind hiring practices within the UNBSU.
