President – Kordell Walsh

Hi folks! It's been a busy couple of weeks here at the office! I hope you've all been having a great summer!

EI-Connect

This has been taking up a lot of my time the past few weeks! I've had regular communication with Devin, the President of UNBSRC in Saint John, as well as the President of FEECUM in Moncton. Rose and I met with the NBSA to discuss where we may align in our advocacy efforts and how we can achieve the best results for students.

Rose and I met with the Fredericton Chamber of Commerce to discuss our approach to EI Connect. One of the arguments was that the government was facing pressures from the business community, so we figured a great way to find a resolution was to talk with the representatives of the business community.

I spent a lot of time this week doing research alongside Rose, and brainstorming potential solutions or alternatives. Then, we had a follow-up meeting with FEECUM, and prepared for a meeting with David Emerson.

CASA

I had a check-in meeting with Lucas, the Government Relations Officer for CASA; as he will be my point of contact for all of my CASA work. I also met with Christian, the Chair of CASA, about goals for the summer and the work throughout the year. Then, I made the agenda and had our first meeting of the National Advocacy Committee.

Governance Project

I've had a few meetings with Mitch Archibald, from Minnikin Resources to discuss doing a governance review of the UNBSU. Minnikin Resources is an organization that does a lot of governance reviews, and has been working with Student Unions in the Maritimes. They offer a lot of guidance and experience; and they can also offer training sessions that can be very valuable.

Overall, the governance review would include working collaboratively with Policy Committee on bylaw and policy reviews.

Vice President Student Wellness - Ridhi Sharma

Happy July, everyone! Hope you all are well and had a relaxing two weeks. I want to start by mentioning that I was out of the office for a day last week as I was travelling. I am excited to share what I have been doing.

Student-Run Businesses Fair

I followed up with the interested individuals regarding their graphics for the agenda ad space, and Amanda and I met to go over the details. We had decided to wait till today for the submission of graphics. I had a meeting with STUSU VP Student Life shortly to discuss the logistics for their event last year.

Meetings

Amanda, Jill, Rose and I met with Matthew Maclean from Counselling Services to discuss and provide feedback on student opportunities that promote mental health on campus.

The executive team attended the accessibility training by Rebecca Ward, which was quite productive, and we learned ways to make our events more accessible and reduce the barriers.

Matthew and I also met separately to talk about the Mental Health Promotion Strategy, during which we discussed survey results and analyzed the stressors pattern in accordance with the months in the academic year. For example, if we already know there usually is a peak in academic distress around October-November, then we can take a preventive approach and tailor our events and campaigns accordingly. We discussed having informal forums and panels in classes about mental health and resources on campus. We also talked about how mental health support may differ in different departments and faculties. Also, to increase engagement with the student body, we thought it would be beneficial if we share events ideas with students beforehand to seek their feedback as well as give them the opportunity to share their ideas.

Black History Month

I met with Alicia Noreiga, graduate student, and Casey Burkholder, professor, whose research focuses on black, queer, and indigenous communities. We met to discuss and address the need to increase representation of black staff and students at UNB. I sought their consultations on event and initiatives ideas, and I also reached out to African Caribbean Society for collaboration in future. If you have any ideas, then I would love to hear from you!

Sustainability Week

I met with Autumn and Jacquie from Sustainability Office to discuss the SDG video campaign and finalized the primary events for the week. We have started reaching out to different societies on campus to discuss collaboration and will also be looking at having friendly competitions between the two campuses. We also discussed the logistics for the meal prep video and are currently working on affordable recipe ideas. So, if you know an easy and quick recipe, then feel free to send it my way. We also discussed the potential of a zine workshop, and I will be meeting Mattia from the library to discuss this further.

SRC Collaboration

I met with the President and VP Student Life from UNB-SRC in Saint John to discuss bi-campus collaboration for the weeks. For the sustainability week, we are looking into having an energy challenge between both campuses. We also spoke about the need for a transition video for international students which goes into campus and academic culture, which I will be bringing up during my meeting with Hillary from ISAO. Bertha, VPSL, and I will be meeting next week to share our weeks' event plans and discuss bi-campus collaboration.

- I watched the recordings of two sessions Education and Training Toolkit to Address and Prevent GBV at Post-Secondary Institutions and Trauma-Informed Workshop from an Indigenous Worldview.

Bits and Pieces

- The Think Tank has been used so much in the past two weeks, it is really nice to have the extra space to work in as a group! We are now starting to slowly clean the Conference Room.
- Our team went to Saint John for a day to meet with the SRC at UNBSJ, it was nice to get to sit down with them and chat about their plans for the year.
- We all completed accessibility training this week with Rebecca from the Student Accessibility Center.
- I attended a meeting with Matt Maclean and some members of our team. We assisted Matt in reviewing the job posting for the peer supporters that they are hiring through the partnership with the Canadian Mental Health Association.

 My communication with Reslife has continued - I am looking forward to soon having a meeting to discuss the House Committee structures in residence and how we can potentially reflect that structure with TownHouse, as well as getting TownHouse involved with the training that residence house committees may receive

Libraries

I also had a very refreshing meeting with Mike Nason from UNB Libraries. Mike does a lot of work around Open Educational Resources (OERs), he was able to teach me about them and we discussed the exam bank that has been worked on by previous VPI's. Since the exam bank has not been touched or updated in a few years, the library did not carry them over to their new system which means they are going to be a bigger challenge to update. They are also hesitant to carry on with the exam bank as many professors will not share their exams since UNB considers them as private material, and due to a lack of efficiency and sustainability in plans to update the bank. However, our conversation around OERs was extremely beneficial for me. He shared the work that Cape Breton University has done on OER advocacy on their campus and I have reached out to their SU to see if I could talk to them about it.

Cost of Education Campaign

Kordell, Lydia and I have started brainstorming ideas for a campaign to raise awareness of the hidden costs associated with getting an education. Lydia has been working on a type form and we are looking forward to getting that out to students so that we can build stats based on our own students here at UNBF.

Senate

This past week I have been working away at committee assignments by reaching out to more societies such as the Law Society, and more faculty societies. I am so grateful that Kordell sent an email to students to share the committee information because we are now getting responses from the committee page on our website! I am looking forward to building a connection with our student senators, as well as the students that I am currently appointing to committees. Kordell and I have also briefly chatted about the "part time senator" position that we have and how we would like to utilize that position for the year.

I also attended my first meeting of Student Standings and Promotions as a Student Senator, I am looking forward to serving on that committee with Kordell for the year.

Council

I have been working away on council and senate work, I have confirmed the dates for council meetings and have booked the space for those meetings throughout the year. Please keep in mind council transition is mandatory and will be happening on **September 18th**. I have chatted with Lydia about her idea of creating binders for councillors and other members of the SU, and I am excited to work on those more with her to ensure they are available for you folks in the fall. Agenda

I finally see the light at the end of the tunnel for the student agenda. A couple of last-minute folks decided they wanted to advertise on the agenda, being the Beaverbrook Art Gallery, Fred Tourism, and GNB. I was able to sell more ad space than the year before, that makes it, so we are able to pay for all the agendas at no cost to the students/UNBSU. This took up a majority of my week last week.

I have spent a bit of time working on research for my first Federal Policy Committee with CASA happening next week. I have spent some time looking at amended policy, research processes, and meeting notes. I have also gotten in touch with Mackenzy Metcalfe about lobby week preparations in Ottawa.

Training

I took part in accessibility 101 training with the Student Accessibility Centre with the entire executive team.

Orientation Chair & Vice-Chair - Jhanvi Joshi and Kanwar Pal Singh Overview

Hello again everyone and happy Friday! The past 2 weeks have been pretty eventful in terms of meetings and collaborations. We are finally seeing everything coming together and taking shape very roughly. The details over the past 2 weeks have been written below:

Marketing

In terms of marketing, the VP Communications has helped us update the orientation website, announcing our logo, theme, executive team (Blackshirts), and a short introduction to Shinerama. At the same time, the Orientation Executives are also being introduced on the orientation Instagram page each day.

Meetings

Over the past 2 weeks, some of the major meetings we had were with; Residence Life Team to plan for Orientation events alongside the Residence Community and ask for updates, and set agendas on the following steps, such as ironing out details in the Orientation Schedule and setting time for events fulfilling both the needs of Townhouse and the Residence community. At the same time, we also had a meeting with Brittany Flowers about check-in day details to make the transition of new incoming students easier, making the process of checking in quicker.

There were also meetings with CSASAs on a possible tri-campus event. Another meeting we had was with Matt Maclean, talking about the possibility of an event related to mental health. This week Action Now Atlantic also reached out to us, chatting about possibly about collaborating with Orientation in form of taking part in Cornboil (or, the Clubs and societies fair) and putting items in the O-Kits.

Merchandise

The Orientation team met with Brian from Coastal Graphics to provide a list of the items in the O-Kits for Townhouse and Residence. We also provided Brian with the Merch details for our Redshirt Orientation Leaders and Executives. We also placed an order for 1300 O-Kits as of now, with the chance of increasing the number at a later date in case we feel it is necessary to do so.

Schedule

The Orientation team has developed a schedule based on the schedules of offices across UNB that will take part in O-Week and has started filling in the timelines of all the events planned to take place.

Sponsorships

The Orientation team discussed the sponsorship hitlist and made changes to the original levels of the sponsorship packages. Offers have been sent out to various internal and external organizations. There was also a meeting with Irving Oil, set with the help of Advancements at UNB. Irving Oil was interested in sponsoring Orientation and possibly taking part in O-Week as well. Our sponsorship package was sent to them and we also chatted about opportunities available where Irving Oil could fit into Orientation Week to increase the engagement of their organization within the UNB Student community as a whole.

RedShirt Orientation Leaders

To date, 100 Redshirt Orientation Leaders have accepted their position and will be a part of Orientation Week. However, there are still a couple of applications on hold due to endorsement-related problems such as no responses or endorsers mentioning that the student had not asked them for endorsements in the first place. At the same time, RLC Steven sent the endorsements for individuals staying in residence over the following academic year.

Redshirts have also been started to split up into different pods that would be led by their respective executives or Blackshirts.

Blackshirt Orientation Leaders

The Orientation Chair and Vice-Chair will soon have a meeting with the executive team talking or providing updates on the merchandise, the schedule, their pods, the events list, etc. At the same time, primaries will be set for each event, who would plan events and prepare event plans! We would also have to ask for volunteer drivers from the team for Blackshirt training and during Orientation Week.

Shinerama and upcoming events

Shinerama finished their National Conference on the 07 th of July which the Orientation team was a part of. However, the turnout was still less with Shinerama still getting into contact with other universities till now. Also, UNB will receive its crowd change website soon to fundraise asap. There have been various delays from their side, but meetings will be held next week with the campaign advisors and regional directors to ease the task of Shine. At the same time, events will be brought in meeting with advisors for shine day and secondary fundraisers. However, we would need to wait to obtain all our Redshirts and Blackshirts together to have a couple of individuals ready to volunteer for events throughout the summer.
