President - Kordell Walsh

Hi folks! I hope everybody's summer is going well! It's hard to believe that we're already almost at the end of July, I feel like the summer just started!! It has been a super busy couple of weeks since our last update.

Meetings

- Rose and I met with FEECUM, David Emerson, and the NBSA regarding our meeting with Minister Holder about the NB-EI Connect program cancellation
- Rose and I also met with Minister Holder, his deputy Minister, and some other folks within the ministry of Post-Secondary Education, Trailing, and Labour (PETL). We felt this was a very productive meeting, and it seems like there's some room for collaboration, whether it be on this issue or others - but it was clear that NB-EI Connect as a program is gone. We're still optimistic that there can be alternatives to the program that still help students implemented.
- I had a meeting with CHSR and Becky from the SUB regarding space in the SUB. There were also some discussions about how we can help promote CHSR and the resources it offers to students
- I scheduled interviews for VP Finance and Operations, however I was unable to attend the interviews themselves due to internet access in Quebec
- I met with Jill to build a plan around scheduling the emergency council meeting and transition sessions
- I met with Danielle and Jacquie from Sustainability to discuss the Student Sustainability Fund (SSF). The SSF is a Student Union funded project, where we take \$1 of every student's Union fees and place them in a fund that students as well as clubs and societies can access to fund sustainability based things (i.e. as small as buying reusable cutlery for a society so they don't continue buying disposable cutlery; or as big as an aquaculture program that they're beginning down at RC). Last year there were some big changes made to the fund that made it more

accessible - and we saw a higher use out of it. The Sustainability office was interested talking about collaborations on promotions primarily, as well as reporting on the Fund's usage, which would be helpful for both of us in promoting sustainability within the university

- I had a meeting with a club regarding an event they are looking to host
- I had a meeting with a student interested in applying for VP Communications but was looking for some more information
- I met with Orientation and Student Services twice where we looked through the planned schedule for orientation week and discussed some last minute adjustments to the schedule
- Lydia, Rose, Jill, Ridhi and I went to Shinerama trivia this week at the grad house! It was lots of fun, and was a great test run with orientation before they begin running public sessions
- I had a meeting with Alanda Banks from GNB regarding promotions of Student Financial Aid, and they will be following up with the entire executive team later - and were interested in possibly bringing forth ideas or a presentation to council around promotions during the year

Travel/CASA

Last week, I spent three days in Quebec for CASA Board retreat! We had sessions to learn more about the history of CASA and the student movement, about our duties as members of the board, and spent a lot of time planning our priorities for the year! It was an extremely productive couple of days, and was a nice change of pace. We ended the conference with a CASA Board meeting, the first time CASA has held an in-person board meeting in a few years, which was really exciting!

Additionally, I spent about a day working on my Board Action Plan for CASA, as well as our committee action plan for the National Advocacy Committee (NAC). CASA's Government and Stakeholder Relations Officer has left CASA, so I also had a meeting with the Executive Director regarding that, how to continue on with CASA's advocacy work, and NAC as a committee.

Odds and Ends

Another somewhat big task I have been working on is preparing a transition for the incoming VP Finance and Operations. I've been working to ensure they're prepared to hit the ground running and up-to-date on as many projects as needed. I am also preparing for the VP Communications transition, even though it is a while away - it's much easier to build both out at once than to repeat my efforts in a couple of weeks.

I am also preparing for a few weeks in advanced, as the week of August 8-12 I will be away in Calgary for CASA with Rose, and the following week I am

planning to take vacation, so I'm trying to get ahead of some projects to make sure I am able to take a break while I am away.

Vice President Student Wellness - Ridhi Sharma

Happy July, everyone! Hope you all are well and enjoying the sun! Things have been quite busy on our end.

STUSU and UNBSU Weeks Collaboration

I met with STUSU VP Student Life to discuss the student wellness weeks and collaboration on events. They were able to provide insights and feedback from the past year's Student-Run Business Fair event and explained the logistics. We will be posting another form soon to gather more businesses from both Universities. We are also looking into the prospect of it being a two-day event, where one day would be in SUB and the other JDH. However, the logistics details need to be ironed out. I discussed the event logistics briefly with Matt Theriault and we will be meeting to discuss this further once Becky returns from vacation.

Anahi was also interested in initiating Sex Week at STU, so we will be meeting closer to the end of the term to discuss events and collaboration between the Student Unions.

Collaboration with HIL

Mattia Fonzo was keen on collaborating and wished for her team to be more involved in our events at the library. We discussed event ideas and spaces on the 3rd floor. We discussed the potential of doing a DIY scrunchie workshop and Zine workshop for Sustainability Week in the Fabrication Lab. We also talked about the Innovation Hub as a great spot for movie nights for smaller groups. Mattia also recommended the event space for guest speakers for our events which can host 50 students. We talked about Pomodoro sessions and study halls for the year. I met with Jill later to discuss the idea for a cafe on plagiarism in collaboration with the Writing Center. If you have any ideas for events at the library, I would love to have your feedback!

EDI training and Experiential Modules

I met with Heidi Harding from the Experiential Office to discuss the program they have been working on as part of their EDI planning. Their team has been working on the UNB Skills Plus program which will provide students with access to a wide range of modules that help prepare them better for the workforce. These modules are usually around an hour long and students will receive certificates at the end which will aid them when they apply for

employment opportunities. I attended the advisory committee meeting as well where a brief overview of the SharePoint modules was given to the staff from different offices on campus. I am one of the student testers and so I have been going through the modules.

Their team is looking for student testers to give feedback on the modules. So, if you are interested then please email Heidi Harding at hhardin@unb.ca and she will be able to give you access to the modules.

Sustainability Week

The sustainability office shared their overall plan of events for the month and recommended that we also disperse our week events across the month. However, after discussion with the team, I realized we should follow the prior years' trend of hosting Sustainability events in the first week of October. So, we have a plan for the week; however, I am waiting for our Wellness Coordinator to finalize things. We are planning to have a beeswax workshop, Pot and Plant, DIY scrunchie workshop, Cellar Pub trivia, wellness workshop, and a giveaway. I would love to hear your thoughts on these and any ideas for potential events!

Campus Culture Campaign

I met with Matthew Maclean to discuss the monthly themes for their office and how we can support students. Matt was also interested in meeting the team for feedback on their social media platforms so that they can reach more students. We discussed some events for wellness week and I gave feedback on the Positive Mental Health Strategy. We also further discussed the ideas for panels and group-focused forums. We agreed that the events should be backed up by evidence-based interventions so I have been researching more. I also suggested the idea of having a late Summer/early Fall volunteer group for Positive Mental Health Strategy as this will allow students to easily volunteer before the start of the year and provide feedback on the work done so far.

Collaboration with ISAO

I met with Hillary Nguyen from the ISAO to discuss event ideas for Cultural Week and potential collaboration for Winter International Student Orientation as it aligns well with Cultural Week. Some of the ideas were a cultural cash workshop during Finance Week, Intercultural Dating for Sex Week, a toolkit for incoming students, etc. We discussed the need for further representation of gueer international students in 203 and potential event that

gives an opportunity to current students to connect with international student alumni.

Odds and Ends

- I reached out to Sofia Mehltiz from 203 to discuss our collaboration for Fredericton Pride Parade.
- I attended the Shine Trivia with the team to support our Orientation folks.
- I attended a virtual conference where I engaged in Intersectional Activism, Storytelling and Breaking Barriers, Menstrual Hygiene and Sustainability.
- I have a meeting with Sodexo staff and the Sustainability Office.

- The Orientation team also met with Kate Morrison from the REDS to book spaces at the Currie Centre for Orientation events.
- The team also met with Brian from IT regarding opt-in plans for students during Orientation Week.
- We also met with Matt Maclean about the mental health event during Orientation Week, and started making a rough plan for it.

Merchandise

As mentioned earlier, we put in orders for the Merch and 1450 Orientation Kits, the final order has been put in and we should receive our O-Kit Items by Mid-August. At the same time, we put in the orders for the merch for RedShirts and BlackShirts. However, for the Orientation Leaders t-shirts and Shine t-shirts we have put in the order and all proofs have been checked. However, we still need to sort out sponsorships for the merchandise.

Schedule

The Orientation team has developed and finalized a schedule based on the schedules of offices across UNB that will take part in O-Week and has also named all the events, the final/latest schedule has been sent out to Marketing. All we await is the green signal from Marketing about the event names and then we can head to Risk Management with the event plans.

Sponsorships

In terms of sponsorships, the only addition we have had to our sponsorship list is Harvest Festival, who have agreed to provide us 10 passes for the Harvest Festival, which we plan to use at events as prizes! Our sponsorship package was also sent to CHSR and also to Cody from Gradhouse. Lastly, we have followed up with Irving Oil about the sponsorship and we also have reached out to the Bookstore and wait for a response from the UNB Alumni.

RedShirt Orientation Leaders

We have finalized our Redshirts and have added them to the RedShirts 2022 Teams channel and Facebook Group. The first step on our agenda is to start

interacting with Redshirts through the Social Media pages. However, a few of the Redshirts were not added to the groups due to a variety of reasons. However, the pod leaders of those Redshirts will reach out to them via email.

Blackshirt Orientation Leaders

The Orientation Leaders are being kept up to date daily about the events and asked for further idea.

Shinerama and upcoming events

The Orientation team had their first in-person event for Shinerama on the 21st of July at the Gradhouse from 12:00 PM to 1:30 PM, the event was a 90s trivia which was open to only the faculty, staff, and the Student Union Executives. However, only the SU executive members were able to attend, and the team was able to raise \$95 in total.

A summer plan for events has been set-up and we will begin marketing those about a week prior to the events. The event plan for Shine Day has been made and showed to the Campaign Advisors and Regional Directors at Cystic Fibrosis Canada and also to Sara and Miriam.

The City of Fredericton has been contacted about door-to-door canvassing during Shine Day on September 10th and permission to take part at the Saturday Market that day and have a Shinerama booth at the Downtown BBQ event.

We have also contacted local businesses to collaborate with events and will reach out to various businesses for sponsorships or events over the month of August.
