1. Call to Order

Chair Gill calls the meeting to order at 6:59pm.

5. Substantive Business

5.1 Faculty Councillor Updates

Computer Science Councillor, Sean Mackenzie, updates that the letter, which was presented last semester and approved for support, has been approved in support of the STU Student Union and NBSA. It has now been sent to the Minister of Post-Secondary Education, the MLA for Fredericton South (Mr. Coon), and the Finance Minister (Mr. Steeves). He has heard back from Mr. Coon, and is hoping to hear back from the others.



Law Councillor, Chris Lutes, updates that he may be speaking to the Ludlow renaming working group. Parking Committee is working on their report, Policy Committee is lit, and elections are underway and there may be more than one person running for his position.

Management Councillor, Molly Pittman, is hiring the new team for the NB Women in Business Conference. She is sitting on a Board of Directors for the Business and Management Undergraduate Society, and they are currently working on the gala. She is working with the Faculty of Management and has been sitting on the Advancement Committee.

Science Councillor, MacKenzie Brimicombe, is trying to organize a meeting with the Dean of Science to discuss a sustainable funding model for the Science Society. She is working with the current presidents and vice-presidents of the existing science societies to organize the Science Gala. She had a meeting with Grace Mangusso and Maggie Forsythe to discuss arranging a sexual assault prevention training for UNB faculty and students.

Engineering Councillor, Shanece Wilson, updates that the iron pin ceremony is occurring this week.

Arts Councillor, Lidia Shibre, is working on her councillor project which is an Arts Formal on February 21st. She sits on the Arts Council, where she is reviewing the strategic plan and quality assurance review for the faculty. She is also on the Search Committee for a new Dean of Arts.

Renaissance College Councillor, Olivia Penney, updates that the RC Green Team will be hosting a destress event in March.

Kinesiology Councillor, Jessie Bennett, is working on creating new study spaces in the Kinesiology Building that are smaller and out of the way, potentially in the green space.

5.2 Sam Arseneau: Club Ratification

UNB Mental Health Association: they were a club a few years ago but have since rebranded a developed a completely new team. Their objective is to provide a safe and positive environment for students to talk about mental health and raise money for related charities. There are no issues in the constitution.

Bouvier: "We ratified a similar mental health group a little while ago. Is there enough difference between the two groups to satisfy the clubs and societies policy?"

Arseneau: "With subjects like mental health, there is enough variation within the subject itself that different groups will not overlap. If it was four different groups all targeted towards soccer, that would be a little much. With something so diverse and important, I do not see an issue with ratifying another club."

Fernandez: "This conversation has happened on council the last two years with the rise of mental health-oriented groups. Both times, council decided that they were not doing overlapping programming and, especially at a university where there is a lack of mental health resources, providing students with those resources is a good thing. It does say in our clubs and societies policy to not have overlapping groups but there is enough diversity for it to make sense, but that is a good point to bring up."

Jefferies: "All these clubs are branches or chapters of nationals groups, so the programming and messaging is very different."

Fazio: "We have had the discussion of duplication of groups over the past couple of years, so do you think that warrants changes and flexibility in our policy?"

Fernandez: "I am sure there is something that could be added to the clubs and societies policy to allow for these kinds of club. Policy Committee could take a look at it, although we are quite busy."

Jefferies: "Last year, Jack.org and UNB Mental Health both hosted a conference. Maybe we can look into limiting that but having the ability to have these different clubs. Maybe we can try to get them to work together rather than hosting two separate conference and both receiving funding from the SU."

Fernandez: "Perhaps we could write some sort of oversight of supervision of programming to ensure that programming does not overlap. I think that would be manageable, it would just require us to get a strategic plan for the year from all clubs and ensure that nothing overlaps, or encourage collaboration between the groups."
